Grants and Staff Additions at Hilltop



We begin this month with great news! The Hilltop Lutheran Neighborhood Center received a \$90 thousand award from the Delaware Department of Education. Center Executive Director, Michelle Williams, says it's a Quality Improvement Award. "The funds (were) dispersed in January and will be used to help supplement staff hiring and retention and to maintain quality in the State Funded Early Care and Education Program (formerly known

as ECAP)"

And speaking of staffing, Center Deputy Director, Brandon Furrowh, announced a couple of new faces now grace our facility. "We have onboarded Ms. Dashaba Fielder and Ms. Dierdre Reynolds. Ms. Fielder, a graduate from Springfield University with over 25 years of experience working with children, has stepped into the role of the Curriculum Coordinator. Ms. Reynolds, also certified as an Early Childhood Education Administrator, will assist our staff for the close of each day as a substitute. These women have served as wonderful additions to our Hilltop family." Welcome aboard to Dashaba and Dierdre!!

In other Hilltop news, the Hilltop Center now has its own food pantry! According to Executive Director, Michelle Williams, it's all thanks to a \$5,000 donation of nonperishable food items from DOTS Foods. "Twenty volunteers from Dots Foods helped to unload the big rig and stock the pantry. They created an assembly line unloading the truck and used carts to get the items to the pantry. The Dots Food HR Manager was also on site and helped to organize the pantry. The process was
