The New Testament LessonActs 9:1-20

Meanwhile Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest ²and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any who belonged to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusa-lem. ³Now as he was going along and approaching Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. ⁴He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?' ⁵He asked, 'Who are you, Lord?' The reply came, 'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. ⁶But get up and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do.' ⁷The men who were travelling with him stood speechless because they heard the voice but saw no one. ⁸Saul got up from the ground, and though his eyes were open, he could see nothing; so they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus. ⁹For three days he was without sight, and neither ate nor drank.

Now there was a disciple in Damascus named Ananias. The Lord said to him in a vision, 'Ananias.' He answered, 'Here I am, Lord.' ¹¹The Lord said to him, 'Get up and go to the street called Straight, and at the house of Judas look for a man of Tarsus named Saul. At this moment he is praying, ¹²and he has seen in a vision a man named Ananias come in and lay his hands on him so that he might regain his sight.' ¹³But Ananias answered, 'Lord, I have heard from many about this man, how much evil he has done to your saints in Jerusalem; ¹⁴and here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who invoke your name.' ¹⁵But the Lord said to him,

'Go, for he is an instrument whom I have chosen to bring my name before Gentiles and kings and before the people of Israel; ¹⁶I myself will show him how much he must suffer for the sake of my name.' ¹⁷So Ananias went and entered the house. He laid his hands on Saul and said, 'Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on your way here, has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit.' ¹⁸And immediately something like scales fell from his eyes, and his sight was restored. Then he got up and was baptized, ¹⁹and after taking some food, he regained his strength.

For several days he was with the disciples in Damascus, ²⁰ and immediately he began to proclaim Jesus in the synagogues, saying, 'He is the Son of God.'



* The Gospel Lesson John 21:1-19

- P: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John the twenty-first chapter.
- C: Glory to you O, Lord.

¹After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. ²Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. ³Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'We will go with you.' They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

⁴Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. ⁵Jesus said to them, 'Children, you have no fish, have you?' They answered him, 'No.' ⁶He said to them, 'Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some.' So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. ⁷That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord!' When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the lake. ⁸But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off.

⁹When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. ¹⁰Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.' ¹¹So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred and fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. ¹²Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, 'Who are you?' because they knew it was the Lord. ¹³Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. ¹⁴This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

¹⁵When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' ¹⁶A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Tend my sheep.' ¹⁷He said to him the third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, 'Do you love me?' And he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep. ¹⁸Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go.' ¹⁹(He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, 'Follow me.'

Sacrament of Holy Baptism

(at the 10:30 a.m. Worship Service)

This morning, Elizabeth Jayne Barron is presented for the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. Elizabeth's parents are Edward and Rebekah Barron and her sponsors are Matthew Shidner and Shannon Kocher.

Sponsors: We present Elizabeth Jayne to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

- P: This child has been presented before us for baptism that she might become a child of God.
- C: Through Baptism we are made children of God!
- P: Martin Luther, in his Small Catechism, teaches that "Baptism brings about forgiveness of sins, redeems us from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe it, as the Word and promise of God declare."
- C: Through Baptism we are made children of God!
- P: "But how can water do such great things? Clearly water does not do it, but rather the Word of God which is with, in, and among the water, and faith, which trusts this Word of God in the water. For without the Word of God the water is plain water and not a baptism, but with the Word of God it is a Baptism, that is grace-filled water of life and a 'bath of the new birth of the Holy Spirit.'"
- C: Through Baptism we are made children of God!
- P: "This baptism signifies that each day the old person in us with all our sins and evil desires is to be drowned through sorrow for sin and repentance, and that each day a new person is to come forth and rise up to live before God in righteousness and purity forever."
- C: Through Baptism we are made children of God!
- P: But Elizabeth is so young! She doesn't know what's going on.
- C: God knows.
- P: How will this child know what God has done for her?
- C: Her parents, family, friends, and we, the church, have the responsibility of teaching her, so that she grows to understand what God has done for her.

- P: Do you, parents, sponsors, and members of Christ's church, accept this responsibility: to bring Elizabeth to the services of God's house; to teach her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments; to place in her hands the Holy Scriptures and provide for her instruction in the Christian faith.
- **C**: We do.

By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you have delivered us from the power of sin and death and set us free to live in you. Wash away the sin of this child who is cleansed by this water and bring her forth as an inheritor of your glorious kingdom. To you be given honor and praise through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

P: I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we baptize. Parents and Sponsors, do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Parents and Sponsor: We do.

P: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? Parents and Sponsor: We do.

P: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? Parents and Sponsor: We do.

P: Let us confess our faith and the faith that Elizabeth is given now. I believe in God, the Father almighty maker of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting. Amen.

- P: Elizabeth Jayne, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- C: Amen.
- P: God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, we give you thanks for freeing your sons and daughters from the power of sin and for raising them up to a new life through this Holy Sacrament. Pour out your Holy Spirit upon Elizabeth Jayne: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence.
- C: Amen.
- P: Elizabeth Jayne, you have been sealed with the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.
- P: This lighted candle is given to Elizabeth to remind her that the Light of the World has come into her life.
- A: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in Heaven.
- P: Let us pray . . . O God, giver of all life, look with kindness upon the father and mother of this child. Let them ever rejoice in the gift you have given them. Make them teachers and examples of righteousness for their child. Strengthen them in their own baptism so they may share eternally with their child the salvation you have given them, through Jesus Christ our Lord.
- C: Amen.
- P: People of St. Philip's Lutheran Church: there are two things you can do for this family. You can pray for Elizabeth and her parents; and you can welcome and accept her as a fellow member of the body of Christ.
- C: We promise to pray for you, Elizabeth, and your family. We welcome you into the Lord's family and as a fellow member of the body of Christ, a child of the same heavenly father, and a worker with us in the Kingdom of God.

Raised on a farm near Camden, South Carolina, Carroll's first music influences were church music and night-time radio. His mother was the church pianist and taught him his first chords on the guitar. Traditional southern gospel and bluegrass would give way to Jim Croce and James Taylor as he entered college. The first paying jobs paid college tuition but would pave the way for his life's work. He first tested the waters in New York but opted for Nashville, Tennessee. There, he worked with songwriters and music publishing and in various studios recording and helping produce nationally released records.

Family matters and money matters brought him back to South Carolina in 1981. He settled in Charleston, where he started a recording studio and music publishing business. A steady gig at the Mills House Hotel helped to pay for his growing family and the dream that refused to die. His family roots include Irish blood and his intense interest in the Irish music led to hosting annual visits to his ancestral homeland.
